

Quartz Hill Clean-Up Guidelines

Troop 146 is responsible for doing Quartz Hill Clean-Up four times per year. It is a requirement for boys to do one clean up each calendar year for rank advancement. Boys can choose between having \$15 dollars applied to their BSA account or the can receive service hours. Once each quarter Bruce Hailstone's office donates \$350 to our troop for this service. The areas we are responsible for will be shown on the attached maps.

1. Each patrol will be responsible for one Quartz Hill Clean-Up per year.
2. Each patrol leader and co-leaders will be responsible for coordinating their scheduled dates for clean up.
3. Patrol parents will be required to attend to drive, ensure safety and be in line with Boy Scout policy of having two adults at all times with the boys.
4. Quartz Hill Clean-up Chair will coordinate with Boy Scouts (activity permit, permission slips), Bruce Hailstone's office, and Los Angeles County Highway department to ensure all procedures are followed, paper work turned in and supplies are available.
5. Patrol leaders/co-leaders must report to Quartz Hill Clean-Up Chair the miles cleaned / number of bags used.
6. Other members of Troop 146 are encouraged to attend and help with the clean-up on each occasion, but are only required to do so once a year.

The procedures to follow on the day of the pick up are attached, along with sign in sheets and maps of the clean up areas.

Quartz Hill Clean-Up Procedure

Prior to activity:

1. Schedule date and time for clean up.
2. Coordinate with Quartz Hill Clean-up Chairperson to ensure all paperwork is complete.
3. Get parent participation to drive and provide guidance and safety.
4. Obtain clean up kit from Quartz Hill Clean-up Chairperson.

Day of activity:

1. Use key in the sign in log to turn down signs at the intersection of Avenue O and 20th St. West; Avenue M and 20th St. West; Avenue M and 60th St. West; Avenue M and 45th St. West.
2. Have all participants sign in the log book noting service hours or \$15 to their account
3. Divide up boys with parents to cover the various stretches of road.
4. Keep count of number of bags filled
5. When clean up is complete, put signs at above locations back in the closed positions.
6. Report to Quartz Hill Clean-up Chairperson the number of bags collected.
7. Return clean up kit to Quartz Hill Clean-up Chairperson.
